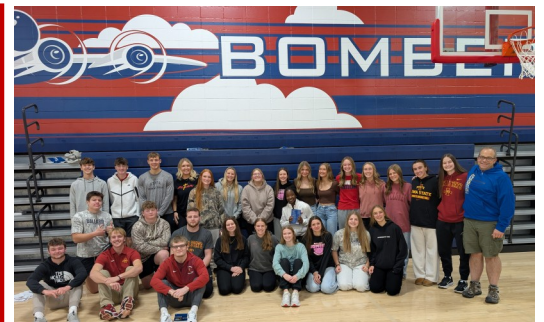
We like to have FCA in homes because it draws different people to be there. Nate Carr shared about the power of the Holy Spirit with this group.
